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**1. OVERVIEW:**

The 2022 New Brunswick Local Government reform resulted in a change to the local government structure and their boundaries within the Southwest New Brunswick Service Commission boundaries and a change to the territory of which the Southwest New Brunswick Service Commission serves. This transitional policy serves to clarify the new boundaries of the Southwest New Brunswick Service Commission and the Local governments in which this policy actions and to amend subsequent articles, sections and schedules this policy uses to effect article 6, cost-share administration of policy RMP1.

**2. AMENDMENTS**

Policy RMP1, except as modified by this transitional policy, is hereby ratified and confirmed and shall remain in full force and effect in accordance with its original terms and provisions. In the case of any conflict between the terms of this transitional policy RMP1-T2023 and the provisions of the RMP1 policy, the provisions of RMP1-T2023 shall control.



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Article 5.2.1 within RMP1 is repealed and replaced with the following:

5.2.1 Notwithstanding Policy 5.2, communities within the Rural District have a population that falls within five high school catchments. To affect the cost-share administration of the Rural Districts' contribution to its respective high school catchments, the apportionment of the contribution shall be assigned based on population data collected by the 2021 Stats Canada Census survey data, if no population data was made available by the Government of New Brunswick Department of Local Government and reform. In the case of Fundy shores Zone 7, the Lepreau population within the Fundy shores zone shall be distributed to Eastern charlotte Zone 6 to reflect the high school catchment which the Lepreau population falls within.

Article 6.1 within RMP1 is repealed and replaced with the following.

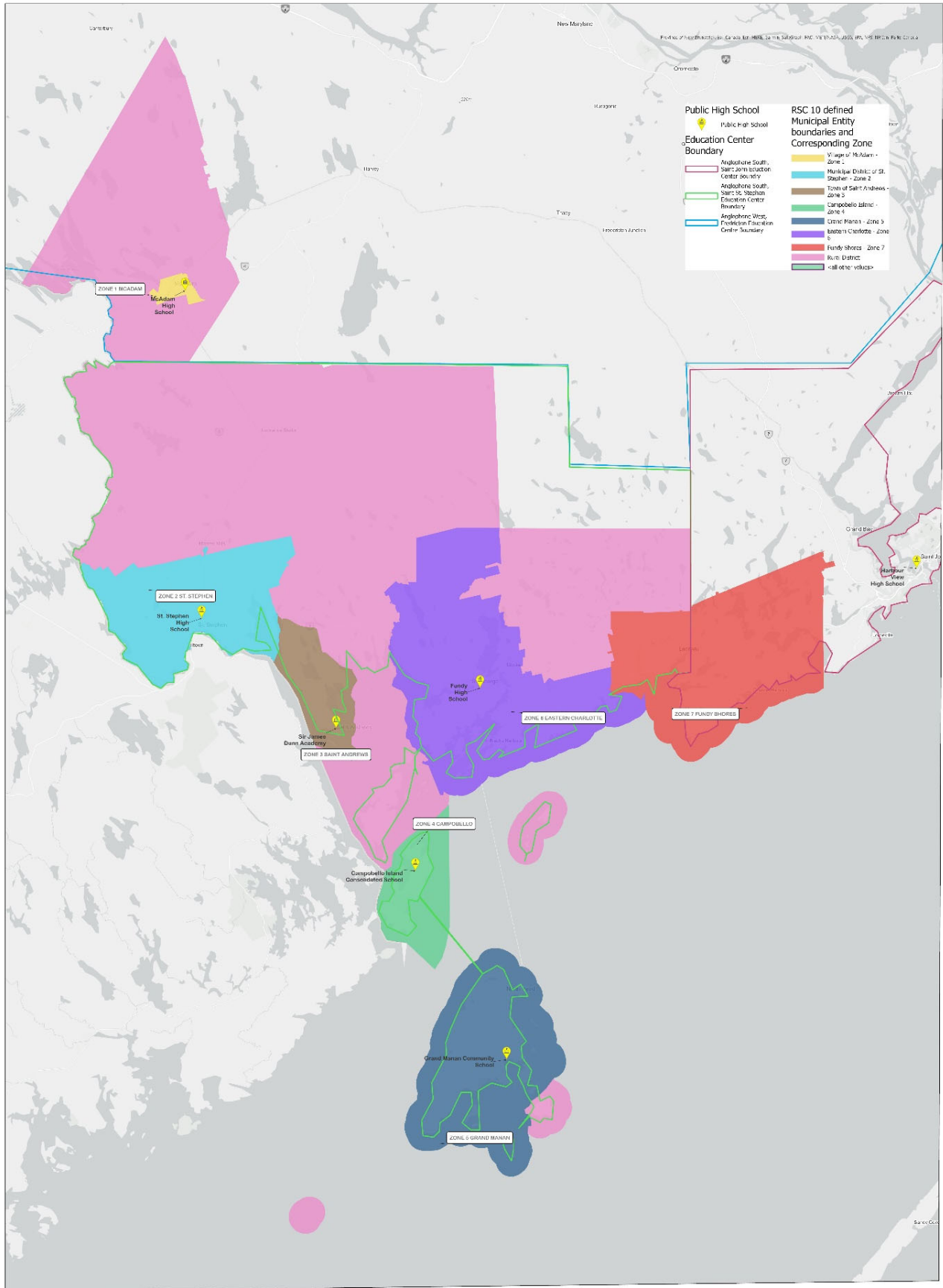
- 6.1 Pursuant to Policy 5.2, the Commission and its members shall charge two cents per one hundred dollars of residential property assessment to all municipalities and the rural district through the Cooperative and Regional Planning Budget. As set out under *Regulation 2012-109* of the *Regional Service Delivery Act*, section 16 (Apportionment of costs), the costs of services provided by or through a Commission shall be apportioned among its members receiving the service. With respect to the costs of common services, other than those referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b) of section 16 of the regulations, apportionment of the regionally collected funds shall be i) 50% based on the tax base of the local government or local service district for the previous year, and (ii) 50% based on the population of the local government or local service district. The collected funds shall be re-distributed to the major recreation facility(s), human resource (Zone Recreation Director) or a combination of both within the respective zone from which the funds were collected, as shown on Figure 1.

Schedules A, B and C are repealed and replaced with the following:
